

TITLE	Democracy matters - meeting 2, discussion
OBJECTIVES	<ul> <li>Students attend digital meetings. The focus will be on a European teenager's reflections on how corona affects their daily life.</li> <li>Students also reflect on what human rights mean to them in everyday life.</li> </ul>
LESSON PLAN	<ul> <li>Pre-activity <ul> <li>(Carried out before the digital meeting.)</li> <li>Ensure that students have prior knowledge of human rights.</li> <li>Time to prepare for the group discussions. Be prepared to account for your own experiences.</li> <li>Same groups 1-8 as in meeting 1.</li> <li>Time to prepare the questions.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Organisation: <ul> <li>Same organisation as meeting 1.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Lesson activity: <ul> <li>Corona and me - a European teenager's reflections</li> <li>How my family has been affected.</li> <li>The changes I have had to make in my life.</li> <li>New habits.</li> <li>Things I have stopped doing.</li> <li>What I am afraid of.</li> <li>How much I think about corona.
